





# **OUR VISION¹ AND MISSION**

# Our vision is that all children and young people are heard and supported to be happy and thrive wherever they are.

We know that children and young people will thrive if the organisations that work with them are supported, resourced, recognised and connected, locally and nationally. Our role is to grow, support and enable place-based collaboration and partnerships focused on the needs of young people and the organisations that support them – we do this through a growing network of Young People's Foundations (YPFs).

# Young People Foundations (YPFs) are locally established, cross-sectorial organisations that seek to sustain CYP delivery in a specific area.

They are independent membership organisations open to any group that work with Children and Young People 0-25. Each YPF is different, working to a flexible model which is shaped by local need and ambitions.

We are growing the number of YPFs across England, building a network of local partnerships in support of young people, and strengthening regional networks in partnership with the Network of Regional Youth Work Units and national partners.

All YPFs focus on collaboration in a place for the benefit of children and young people and the organisations that seek to work with them.

YPFs are designed to meet local need, and therefore look different and focus on different activities depending on the area.

They do all share a common set of principles which connect them:

- **Inclusivity** membership is open to any group working with children and young people, with no limit on numbers. An equal voice will be given to all organisations, no matter their size
- Diversity YPFs value the multitude of organisations that deliver youth and children's work. There is a need for variety in order to meet the needs of as many young people as possible
- Collaboration YPFs are non-competitive and encourage collaboration between members.
  The YPFs will work to fundraise, coordinate and network to benefit their whole membership.
  They will not compete against their members nor delivery services which members could do
- **Cross-sector** the needs of children and young people must be addressed by the public, voluntary and private sectors as a group rather than individually
- **Grassroots** the YPFs work for, and with, small local organisations and retain their local focus
- Long-term YPFs are designed for the long term. They are a constant; there for local young people past the traditional three or four-year terms of funding programmes or Local Authority term in office.

we are open and transparent, with ourselves and with partners - we are clear on what we do, why and what we don't do

#### BE ACCOUNTABLE

we ensure that our members, partners and children and young people can hold us to account, challenge us and that we can demonstrate our value and impact

We believe that if we are all able to support partnerships to thrive then places will be better, and that will lead to stronger local services and organisations.

Ultimately, this will impact on the lives of children and young people. We do not underestimate the complexity of the challenge faced, nor the interventions needed - our work is informed by this complexity and the role we feel we can play in making change happen.

### **HOW WE WORK**

All of our work is shaped by four key principles:

#### 1. PEOPLE

we put people first, within and outside the network, and want to be an outstanding employer and a champion of equity, inclusion and rights. We are enablers and facilitators of others, bringing people together.

#### 2. PARTNERSHIP

we always work with others, never alone. We are better when we work with others, and we know that collaboration makes children and young people's lives better. We do it and champion it in all we do. We provide space and platforms for others, not ourselves.

#### 3. PLACE

we focus on local and put local first. We are a network of local partnerships, not a national infrastructure charity, driven by the needs and ambitions of our members and in turn their members and children and young people locally. To support this:

#### WE ARE LED BY NEED

we identify and seek to meet the needs and ambitions of others, including children and young people directly, and our members, first and foremost.

#### WE MUST TACKLE SYSTEMIC POVERTY AND INEQUALITY


we know that real change comes when the system works for children and young people, their families and the organisations who support them.


#### WE ARE ANTI-RACIST AND ANTI-DISCRIMINATORY








To achieve our mission, we focus on three things.
